Dr. Aggie Weighill

Aggie Weighill started her scholarly relationship with recreation in 1995 at Vancouver Island University (formerly Malaspina University-College) before moving onto Acadia University (Nova Scotia), the University of Waterloo (Ontario), and finally the University of Alberta. Focusing on the relationship between women's leisure and community, her master's research explored non-traditional leisure activity and the creation of communities of interest. Her doctoral work explored gendered aspects of sport tourism, with an emphasis on adult recreational players rather than elite athletes.

She has taught in the Department of Recreation and Tourism Management at Vancouver Island University since 2005 and continues to engage in community recreation and tourism projects on Vancouver Island as well as Ghana and Tanzania on the African continent. Aggie's work remains focused on issues of social justice and gender within recreation, tourism, and sport.





Joanne schroeder

Joanne Schroeder is a faculty member in the Department of Recreation and Tourism, Vancouver Island University, Canada since 2000. Numerous roles have included administration, teaching, research and supervision, community engagement and development of experiential learning such as field schools and study tours. She is currently the Director of the World Leisure Centre of Excellence at Vancouver Island University and the Chair of the World Leisure Organization.

Passionate about community involvement and industry connections, her previous experiences include private consulting, training and professional development; predominantly working in municipal recreation departments for over 20 years across Western Canada.
