**Note:** The Yukon Wildlife Preserve staff will be opening the gates outside of their regular operating hours for us to enter and be shuttled to the Learning Centre. <u>Please arrive on time</u>, as the gates will close again before they start shuttling us to the venue, and will not reopen to the public until after 10:00 AM.

#### Additional Considerations for Day 1 Events & Activities

**Vehicle Access & Shuttling:** Vehicles are only allowed in the parking lot of the Wildlife Preserve. Staff will shuttle participants from the parking area to the Learning Centre at the start of the day and again at the end of the day. Shuttling will also be provided on an as-needed basis throughout the day. To minimize the need for shuttling, please be mindful and limit unnecessary trips.

**Dinner Staggering:** Due to significant participation, groups will be staggered for dinner at the Hot Rock Café by approximately 45 minutes. Please consider if you can shuttle out immediately for dinner or if you can stay at the Learning Centre a bit longer with the option of walking out of the Wildlife Preserve.

**Clothing:** Bring warm clothes and proper footwear as there will be outdoor icebreaker activities and a tour of the preserve.

**Footwear:** Outdoor footwear is not allowed inside the Learning Centre. It is recommended to bring indoor slippers to use while inside.

WiFi & Cell Service: Please note that there is no WiFi available, and cell service is limited at the Yukon Wildlife Preserve.

**Washrooms:** There is no running water at the Learning Centre, and outhouses will be available for washroom use.
