Greetings! With children returning to school this fall with Covid measures in place, educational staff have definitely been challenged to make the learning environment safe for everyone. In the various schools I have visited, they have done a fantastic job. No doubt, this has been stressful for all involved. Hats off to you!

The plight of RPAY's Active Playground Experience (APE) program was unknown prior to school beginning. I began by sharing Covid friendly games with students on the playground during recess at Elijah Smith Elementary School. Once children settled in to the various routines both indoors and out, I saw the possibility of delivering the APE program outdoors. And that's exactly what happened.

Armed with hand sanitizer, wipes, a mask and many fun games, I have been able to meet several classes outside; the Grade 6 students at Whitehorse Elementary School have met me at Shipyards Park to run, play, and learn about leadership, primarily about communication and conflict resolution.

CANADIAN PLAYGROUND SAFETY INSTITUTE

Moving training online this fall

Canadian Playground Safety Institute (CPSI) is offering a series of on-line certification and recertification courses for playground inspectors. Regular inspection of playgrounds by qualified inspectors is important in ensuring that playgrounds meet baseline safety standards for use by children. If you're already certified, re-certification needs to occur every three years. The last training offered in the Yukon was held in October 2017.

If you are a rural local government, First Nation, or rural community organization that manages a playground, subsidies may be available to support your course fees. For more information and to request financial support, contact jenyfer@rpay.ca Subsidies will be considered on a first-come first-serve basis subject to available funds.

Funding applications open October 13th

A lack of funding dedicated to creating equitable opportunities for women and girls to participate and lead in the sport system is a barrier to achieving gender equity in Canada.

Since 2004, Canadian Women and Sport has awarded \$250,000 in grants through our WISE Fund to leaders and organizations across Canada to help address this gap.
